London	Big Brothers Big Sisters of London & Area	\$18,850	Be Active Volunteer Training	This project will create volunteer mentor training resources that will help 100 volunteers to integrate physical literacy and activity into their mentoring relationships. This is to ensure that all children being served by BBSOLA are physically literate and active.
Hamilton	Blessed Sacrament Yellow Jackets Basketball Club	\$67,760	Little Jackets	This project will establish an introductory basketball program based on CS4L principles for 3,000 children age 6 and under, and deliver appropriate training for leaders in the early child care sector. The project's aim is to create 200 qualified leaders.
London	Boys and Girls Club of London	\$80,066	London's Act-i-Pass Program	The project will further develop a recreation pass that allows grade 5 students in London to access physical activity programs at no cost. The program will be offered to all four school boards with an estimated 5,000 children benefitting.

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Chatham	Chatham Y Pool Sharks	\$40,838	Chatham Y Pool Sharks: "Swim With The Sharks!"	This project will develop and implement a swim program for 364 swimmers aged 6-12 years based on LTAD Stages 2 & 3 and the FUNdamentals to Train program.
Hamilton	City of Hamilton	\$49,140	The 2015 Pan American Games Legacy Project	This project will train staff and volunteers in physical literacy and CS4L and establish a youth soccer league in the vicinity of the new Pan Am Soccer Stadium in Hamilton that will engage 540 participants and help them to learn fundamental movement skills.
London	City of London	\$59,127	Ageless Grace	This project will increase sport and physical activity opportunities for adults over 55 years who have limited mobility or are new to Canada. The project aims to offer 9,000 opportunities for participation and will teach fundamental movement skills.
Windsor	Family Respite Services Windsor/Essex	\$11,174	Fantastic Fridays	The project will provide the opportunity for an additional 20 children and youth with disabilities, between the ages of 8 and 18, to participate in the "Fantastic Fridays" program at the Vollmer Centre, which is offered two Fridays a month (activities include swimming, dance and recreation-based activities).
Waterdown	Flamborough Information & Community Services	\$49,090	New Social and Recreation Centre for Flamborough Seniors	This project will create 9,000 opportunities for participation for seniors in Flamborough. Seniors who participate will develop organizational capacity and implement recreational programming for their peers at a new seniors recreation centre.

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St. Thomas	Forest City Velodrome Association	\$29,458	Active for Life Re-Generation	This project will build the capacity of the Forest City Velodrome Association by training four more coaches and purchasing new club bicycles. Additionally, the project will remove barriers and create 600 participation opportunities for "Active for Life" cyclists.
London	Forest Edge Community Club	\$58,771	Forest Edge Extreme Experience	This project will develop and implement physical activity programs for 250 low income, new immigrant children and youth in the Westmount neighbourhood of London, removing barriers, increasing participation, and teaching physical literacy.
Hamilton	Hamilton & District Extend-A-Family	\$56,646	IMPACT - Improving Movement and Physical Activities in Children and Teens	This project will provide a year-round fundamental movement skill and physical literacy development to 40 children and youth with a disability by means of a two-phase physical activities program, the second of which features one-on-one/small group excursions for participants with their caseworkers.
Owen Sound	Hanover Town of , Parks, Recreation & Culture	\$6,435	Aquatic Sports Fun	The project will actively engage 80 youth ages 8 to 12 years in a nine week fall and winter Aquatic Sports Fun program as well as five "Try It Sport Fun" days where they will develop fundamental sport skills and participate in different water sports, aquatic fitness, water safety and personal leadership training.

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London	London Optimist Sports Centre	\$123,500	London Multicultural Sports Initiative	This project will increase the London multi-cultural community's participation in physical activities and sports through a multi-cultural sports festival and a year long series of recreational sports/physical activities programs that will provide opportunities to participants to develop fundamental movement skills. The project expects to reach 2,500 participants.
London	London Regional Children's Museum	\$20,840	Active Play = Healthy Day	This project will introduce and integrate fundamental movement skills into the London Regional Children's Museum summer day camps, which accommodate 600 children ages 3-12 years annually, and further develop a Cycling Camp for 9 to 12 year olds.
Hamilton	Rygiel Supports for Community Living	\$39,846	Home Based Adaptive Exercise Program	This project will deliver an adaptive, in-home gym program to up to 25 clients with a severe disability. The project removes barriers to participation in physical activity and will increase the capacity of staff, families of clients, and the broader community in terms of understanding the specialized needs of this target population.
Owen Sound	Satellites Gymnastics Club	\$72,000	Expanding Capacity and Opportunity for children, special needs clients and aboriginal peoples in Owen Sound and Wiarton	This project will expand the capacity of the Satellite Gymnastics Club to offer additional programming for 130 children in Owen Sound and extracurricular activities after school in conjunction with the Bluewater School Board.

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London	St. Leonard's Community Service London & Region	\$57,765	Just Play Sports	This project will teach 288 low income youth the fundamentals of sport, based on the CS4L policy. It will also build the capacity of community partners so they can deliver these programs beyond the funding period.
LaSalle	Town of LaSalle	\$40,743	Play Your Way	This project will provide a physical literacy and fundamental movement skills program for children aged 4-11 years, six days a week. The project will also build capacity through the hiring and training of 12 qualified leaders.
Sarnia	Township of St. Clair	\$8,000	Sport For Life Equipment Purchase & Loan Program	This project will develop an equipment purchase and loan program to increase access to sport and recreation programs in rural areas of St. Clair Township. The program will offer 1,500 opportunities for participation.
Kincardine	Walkerton Golf and Curling Club	\$31,288	Rock Your Way To A Healthy Lifestyle	This project will hire a part-time project coordinator to implement new plans, programs and events to grow both the participation and capacity of the Walkerton Golf and Curling Club. The project will create new leaders and involves the participation of 200 volunteers.
Welland	Welland Recreational Canal Corporation	\$100,000	Welland Indoor Paddle Tank Program	This project will leverage the legacy value of this unique venue for flatwater sports, making paddling and rowing activities available and accessible year round. The tank will remove barriers, increase accessibility, and aid in the teaching of fundamental movement skills to 400 youth, 1600 adults, and 100 para-sporters over the course of two years..

Strathroy	YMCA of Western Ontario - Middlesex Centre	\$17,444	YMCA of Middlesex Centre Rural Program Expansion	This project will introduce physical activity programs for 133 children, youth and seniors in the rural municipality of Middlesex Centre. The project will also build capacity by training program instructors/staff in fundamental skills, and purchasing program/safety equipment.

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
